# 9:01 a.m. Approval of Minutes

October 1, 2019 Commissioners' Meeting Minutes were approved as presented.

# 9:01 a.m. PUBLIC HEARING to Amend DARE Trust Fund

Captain Ronelle Nelson gave a background of the DARE trust fund. Discussion on whether the DARE program will continue.

Commissioner Koch opened the public hearing at 9:06 a.m., allowing for public comment on the subject. Sheriff Raymond listed some of the specific items this fund supports are; DARE, drones, custom vests, Explorers, and National Night Out to name a few. Commissioner Koch closed the public hearing at 9:09 a.m.

#### 9:10 a.m. Franklin County Noxious Weed Board 2020 Budget

Program Coordinator Todd Harris presented the Weed Board 2020 with the biggest changes being in wages. After discussion, Commissioner Peck suggested the process of salary increases be consistent and uniform in the future.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2019-311, Approval of 2020 Noxious Weed Budget, with discussion. Commissioner Didier seconded and the motion carried.

# 9:22 a.m. Closed Record Hearing CUP 2019-05

• Commissioner Peck recused himself from this closed record hearing, as he is an event center owner and the CUP 2019-05 being discussed today is about an outdoor event center.

Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten and AHBL Personal Services Contractor MillieAnne VanDevender brought CUP 2019-05 before the Board. MillieAnne read the background on the outdoor event center. It stated it would have a portable restroom, banquet tents and parking spaces. The Planning Commission reviewed the application and recommended denial of the CUP as amended, and there were no appeals filed.

 Commissioner Didier moved to approve the recommendation of the Planning Commissioner and deny CUP 2019-05 based upon the written findings of fact. Commissioner Koch seconded.

Administrator Keith Johnson clarified typo on page 8 staff report, under Suggested Conditions of Approval 1, b. Portable toilets may be used to supplement large events (shall may) not be the only restroom available. To simply say, (shall).

Draft Minutes of September 24, 2019 under Planning Commission Discussion, Commissioner Vincent asked how long this CUP will be in effect. Mr. Braaten said he does not think there is (not) an expiration on this application. Remove (not).

# 9:35 a.m. Adoption of Revised County-Wide Planning Policies

AHBL Personal Services Contractor Nicole Stickney related the background for the revision on the county-wide planning policy. Franklin County is a "fully planning" county under the state Growth Management Act (GMA). The Board passed Resolution 2017-324 (Nov. 1, 2017), taking official legislative action to initiate the periodic update of the Franklin County Comprehensive Plan, as required by the GMA. The periodic update is still underway, as the County cannot complete the update until the Urban Growth Area adjustments, as requested by the Cities of Connell and Pasco, can be processed (the Pasco request is pending an EIS).

At this time, the County should adopt updates to the County-Wide Planning Policies as required by RCW 36.70A.210(3). This action will update the policies, which were last adopted in 1993 (Res. 93-015). Adoption of the policies will provide the necessary framework for the Cities and County to complete their periodic updates.
