9:24 a.m. Administration Office Business

- Administrator Keith Johnson presented the Non-Bargaining Cost of Living Adjustment 2020 Resolution 2019-396 before the Board. A 2% cost of living adjustment is recommended based on budgeted funds availability and market conditions, including the Consumer Price Index, comparable, and neighboring counties.
- * Commissioner Koch moved to approve Resolution 2019-396. Commissioner Peck seconded. After discussion on unfunded mandates and the growth management act the motion carried 2:0, Commissioner Didier abstained.
- Discussion on whether to lease or sell the Wilson House, which LifePoint Health organization is now leasing. Commissioners entertained the option of leasing for approximately six months until they could have an executive session on this matter. They also would like to discuss the future of the HAPO center and RV Park.
- Mr. Johnson commended the Sheriff Jim Raymond, Commander Steve Sultemeier
 and their office for the outstanding work they did in managing the class action
 lawsuit on our jail facility. It has been a difficult and expensive task to bring it up
 to code. All Commissioners agreed that they did a great job and appreciated their
 hard work.

9:48 a.m. Budget Business

- * Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2019-397, adoption of Franklin County 2020 Current Expense Budget with discussion. Commissioner Koch seconded with discussion. After discussion on unfunded mandates and benefits, the motion carried 2:1. Commissioner Didier opposed.
- * Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2019-398 adoption of the Franklin County 2020 Miscellaneous Budgets. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried 2:1. Commissioner Didier opposed.
- * Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2019—399. Commissioner Koch stated we are not to that point. Commissioner Peck rescinded the motion.
- * After discussion, the letter to the Assessor stating that there will be a shift from County Road Department to County Current Expense for 2020 received consensus from Commissioner Peck and Commissioner Koch. Commissioner Didier opposed.
- Commissioner Didier moved to approve resolution 2019-399 amending the Board positions stay the same as 2019 and allow Commissioner Didier to serve on the Eastern Washington Association of Counties. Motion died for lack of a second.



- Commissioner Peck moved to approve resolution 2019-399 as presented. Motion died for a lack of a second.
- * Commissioner Didier moved to approve assignments as maintained in the 2019 year, with amendment that Commissioner Didier would serve on the Eastern Washington Association of Counties in 2020. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried 2:1. Commissioner Peck opposed.

10:04 a.m. Public Comment

- Curt Didier questioned County insurance and asked whether its rates had dropped.
- Lawanda Hatch thanked Commissioner Didier for attending the meeting during this difficult time, as his son just had major heart surgery. She appreciated the Board and wanted them to know she will stand as the voice of the people and relay what they are saying. She wished all of the Board a Merry Christmas.

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- Jeffery Robinson would be praying for Commissioner Didier's son. He wished the Board a Merry Christmas and thanked them for all that they do.
- Merle Booker voiced his concerns on the budget shortfall and agreed with Commissioner Peck in not supporting the unfunded mandates. He would like to see growth management act addressed, as well as budget cutting programs. He wished the Board a Merry Christmas.
- Victor Scott gave his well wishes to Commissioner Didier's son. Mr. Scott voiced his concerns of improprieties happening within the legal system.
- Commissioner Didier asked if the Board would participate in a letter of support as well as
 to thank Pierce County for their stepping up and challenging King County on the I-976
 matter.
 - Prosecuting Attorney Shawn Sant read the deadlines and explained the consequences if Franklin County were to get involved legally.
- After discussion, the Board agreed to have a letter drafted and reviewed by Mr. Sant prior to consensus.
- George Dockstader asked the Board to look at the budget cuts for next year and review the unfunded mandates to see which ones take priority.
- Rocky Mullen voiced his opinion in regards to liquidation of county equipment and it being done by auction and not by sales or trade in.

The next Commissioners Meeting will be held January 7, 2020.

Commissioner Didier thanked all those who kept his son in thoughts and prayers.
