Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

9:01 a.m. **Approval of Minutes**

❖ January 14, 2020 Commissioners' Meeting Minutes were approved as presented.

9:01 a.m. Legislative Update

Zak Kennedy gave a brief update to the Commissioners as follows:

- Unfunded mandate money is going towards the homelessness problem.
- Sex Ed for K-12 had passed around 3 a.m.
- Most gun bills died.

Mr. Kennedy will give final report next week as the session is ending, and the final budget is in process.

9:11 a.m. Franklin County Historical Museum Presentation

Executive Director Richard Scheuerman presented the Board with a framed plaque of the golden woman pouring water that is located in the Courthouse rotunda. It gives a brief history of the statue. He also thanked the Commissioners for helping with replacement of the front steps.

9:16 a.m. HAPO Center Energy Audit- McKinstry

Boone Birdsell presented a Power Point presentation to the Board, which included an itemized list of what they found and the critical items that need fixing.

- 80% of HVAC is close to its extended life.
- Arena does not have air conditioning.
- Compressors in the ice rink are outdated and cost ineffective.
- Damage to refrigerant lines, condensing unit, gas heater exhaust piping, and insulation on the Atrium.

Potential items to improve on.

- Geothermal Heat Pump System
- Solar
- Expanded cooling capacity for the Arena
- Centralized HVAC Mechanical Room
- Energy Efficiency updates to include building envelope and building controls upgrades
- A more efficient lighting system.
- Water saving measures.

Mechanical Replacements estimated mechanical equipment- \$3.6 million

- Chiller
- HVAC
- Gas Heaters
- Boilers and Hot Water Heaters

Additional equipment and options: \$.5 mil to \$5 mil

- Building Controls
- Lighting
- Building envelop upgrades
- Water efficiency upgrades

Mr. Boone suggested to turn HAPO into a FEMA site and there is new money available 5116 CETA- Clean Energy Transfer Act.

9:48 a.m. Update of Whistleblower Policy

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave introduced a new Whistleblower policy that is a hotline through a third party allowing reports to remain anonymous if desired. After brief discussion on how the system works, the Commissioners brought it to a vote.

- Administrator Keith Johnson reported on his trip to Washington D.C. NACo meeting. Covid-19 was discussed quite a bit. Unfunded mandates, PILTS, SRS payments, Columbia River Treaty and Water issues were some of the main topics.

10:09 a.m. Public Comment

Assessor Peter McEnderfer voiced his concerns on the HAPO Center and the request from the Washington State Department of Commerce.

The Washington State Department of Commerce is requesting and utilizing "assessor' data for implementation and enforcement of RCW 19.27a.210 "State energy performance standards" for commercial buildings over 50,000 sqft. "Assessor" data should only be used for property tax purposes and this legislation puts the assessor as a participant in the process, whether they should be or not.

10:13 a.m. Commissioner Peck announced a public hearing regarding Redistricting will be held next week. The State and County process is not the same. This has been going on for two years and will be discussed further in the public hearing.

The reason Commissioner Peck held off on the KGH feasible study was to confirm what was included in the study, such as asbestos, lead paint and other unknown possible hazmat items. He met with the three members of the Hospital district. He was given a tour of the old Kennewick Hospital and reviewed documents of previous hazmat studies that have already been completed.

The feasibility study the was proposed, did not indeed cover the concerns of hazmat items. After gaining additional information from this meeting with the Hospital District and having had his previous concerns answered, Commissioner Peck agreed we ought to move forward with the feasibility study.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve \$12,500 for the Hospital District to do a feasibility study previously briefed to us. Commissioner seconded and the motion carried.
