#### 9:09 a.m. Approval of Consent Agenda

- 1. Resolution 2020-127 Benton-Franklin Workforce Development Appointment-Lori Mattson
- 2. Resolution 2020-128 Franklin County Travel Policy Amendment
  - \* Commissioner Peck moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Commissioner Didier asked to pull #2 for separate discussion. All in favor to approve resolution 2020-127.
  - \* Commissioner Didier asked for clarification on the new travel policy resolution 2020-128 and the discrepancies between resolutions 2012-184 and 2019-050. Administrator Keith Johnson clarified that because resolution 2019-050 did not include reference to 2012-184, it was required to add 2012-184 in resolution 2020-128 to clean up discrepancies and make it consistent in a single policy.
  - \* Commissioner Peck moved to approve resolution 2020-128. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried 2:1. Commissioner Didier opposed.

#### 9:23 a.m. **Public Comment**

- Lisa Merrill thanked the Board for doing what they can to get the county running. She
  had concerns about the broken reflectors on the sides of the road and the money spent
  on them.
- Michelle Andres asked if there was any response to the letters written by the counties
  to Governor Inslee. Commissioner Koch replied that there was no response. Ms. Andres
  believed that the community could mitigate and operate.
- Administrator Keith Johnson spoke of a letter Benton County sent last week to the Governor requesting the opening of the food service industry. In the letter, it mentions a coalition of bars and restaurants in the Tri-Cities area. Would the Franklin County Board like to send a similar request?
- Commissioner Didier was asked to meet with a road crew and see the restrictions they are working with. He stated they were concerned for the wellbeing of themselves and others, as the Personal Protective wear inhibits their sight and poses a danger.
- \* Commissioner Didier made a motion to open Franklin County for business and challenge the Governor. Motion dies for lack of a seconded.
- Commissioner Peck reiterated that Franklin County Commissioners do not have the
  authority to overrule the Governors orders and it is misleading to the community to
  think otherwise, and could potentially hurt the citizens. The citizens need to send in
  letters in mass to the Governor.

- Administrator Keith Johnson asked if the Board would like to renew the Energy Communities Alliance (ECA).
- \* After discussion, the Board agreed to bypass this year's renewal and see where we stand financially next year.

#### 9:35 a.m. Public Comment

- Auditor Matt Beaton wanted to make a clarification on a travel expense statement that
  the Auditor and others who review expense records are attesting to the expense only.
  The person submitting the expense attests with their signature that what is being turned
  in is correct.
- Lawanda Hatch voiced her concerns on being a self-employed person with no employees and the difficulties of getting unemployment. She is also concerned with the continued shutdown of businesses and they need a leader that will stand with them and defend their rights.
- Stephen Bauman voiced his concerns on opening the county and asked Commissioner Peck in what ways can we add pressure to the Governor to allow us to do so. He also gave an update on the problems he is facing with building in the donut hole area and the inconsistencies between the City of Pasco and Franklin County.
- Lawanda Hatch said the City Council does not make the decisions, it is the City Manager and that is where Mr. Bauman needs to go for answers. She had been told that the reason Franklin County did not have business growth like Benton County is due to the complexities of building here.
- Rocky Mullen agreed with Mr. Bauman that the City of Pasco makes it difficult for businesses to come here and that is why they go to neighboring cities. He encouraged the Commissioners to find a way to change this problem.
  - He also asked if there was anything in the works to open Franklin County, or are we just waiting for the Governor to take action. He voiced his concerns on owning rentals and not being paid. He asked how long will this go on, as he has mortgages to pay also. He is worried about those who do not qualify for loans or unemployment and the wellbeing of families.
- Commissioner Didier quoted Abraham Lincoln, "If you want to test a man's character, give him power".
- Commissioner Peck stated that the Governor is in a unique position that he was given power from the people. Unless and until it gets in front of a court and gets to be judged

unconstitutional, it will remain. He suggested getting the right message to those that are close to the Governor. Organizing Westside campaigns may be the best course.

• Lawanda Hatch voiced her concerns as to why it is not be appropriate for the County to sue Governor Inslee for loss of property taxes.
