Human Services Director Kyle Sullivan gave a background of Homeless Housing fund also known as 2163, which fills gaps in services. It provides rental assistance for those who have not been able to work during this COVID-19 Period.

Administrator Keith Johnson gave a background on the CARES act funds and what items can be covered under this act. Franklin County was awarded \$5,207,400 with restrictions for use. It is to be used primarily for public health measures due to COVID 19. There has been a request from the Tri-City Regional Chamber to help small businesses with micro grants.

Commissioner Peck thought it was a good idea to submit a Phase 1.5 application. Commissioner Koch agreed.

Commissioner Didier moved to open the county for business based on the 63% accuracy of the Covid-19 testing. The motion died for lack of second.

The Board directed Administrator Keith Johnson to discuss and review with the Health District and obtain a response from them to move forward with a phase 1.5 and incorporate a list of businesses such as construction for this application. They also requested a special meeting to vote on this matter as timely as possible.

- Stephanie Swanberg supports the small micro grant program.
- George Dockstader was concerned that a majority of money going to the Regional Chamber would be spent in Benton County. He would like both counties to work together to open up.
- Stephanie Swanberg mentioned that the micro brands would go through a collaboration of several different groups and not just the Regional Chamber.
- Rocky Mullen was concerned with the mandate of masks and asked if there was a waiver in place.
