Administrator Keith Johnson update

- NACo (National Association of Counties) held their annual conference last week
- American Rescue Act Plan discussions
- McKinstry working on the HAPO Center energy audit. May be complete by the end of September.
- Economic Development Review Committee working on .09 projects, which will come before the board in a few weeks
- Tri-City Regional Water- discussion on the Columbia River and retain the Snake River Dams
- Delta Works hired by Benton County Emergency Services to provide strategic planning/consultation
- Municipal Advisory Committee is in the process of closing down the Columbia Basin College (CBC) site for Covid-19 Vaccinations. The site will close on July 19.

- Odessa ground water replacement project and obtaining funding to assist this program

9:13 a.m. Closed Record Hearing CUP 2021-01- Event Center in AP-20 Zone

* Commissioner Didier opened the closed record hearing at 9:13 a.m.

Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten gave a background of CUP 2021-01 The applicant proposes to establish and operate an indoor/outdoor event center on parcel 108-060-057, located South of Levey Road, West of the Snake River and East of Rogers Road. The property is zoned AP-20 and the Comprehensive Plan designation is Agricultural. The proposed activities are private events and would take place primarily indoors, with some activities conducted outdoors. The applicant proposes to use approximately 1.92 acres of the 27.9 acre site for the proposed use, which will include a 6,500 sq. ft. two-story single-family dwelling, 4,500 sq. ft. auxiliary building for event hall, 4,800 sq. ft. outdoor event space and 104 parking spaces. Events would have a range of 200-250 people in attendance. The County Building and Planning Department processed the application, coordinated for agency comments, and reviewed the application in accordance with Chapter 17.82 Franklin County Code.

The County Building and Planning Department staff provided the Planning Commission with a written recommendation of approval for the application. Subsequently, at their meeting on May 4, 2021, the Planning Commission held a duly advertised open-record public hearing and unanimously passed a motion (7-0) to forward a recommendation of approval, based on six findings of fact and with seventeen suggested conditions of approval. There were no appeals.

9:44 a.m. PUBLIC HEARING -Vacation of Easement 2021-02 531 Levey Road

* Commissioner Didier opened the Public Hearing at 9:44 a.m.

Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten gave a background to the Vacation of Easement. An application to vacate a 30' wide, private access easement (AFN #554778), starting at the north center of the property, and extending southwest to the south border of Lot 2 of Short Plat 2019-05. The land is zoned Agricultural Production 20 (AP-20).

Parcel #108-060-042 is addressed as 531 Levey Road. The easement runs from the approximate center of the north property line, southwest, along a ridgeline, with 15%-40%+ slopes to the east, and active vineyards to the west. The Snake River is to the east of the property. The applicants stated that this easement was recorded without his permission and is redundant. The property has a second existing access/egress (AFN #1619162) to serve the lot.

Commissioner Didier asked for public comment 9:56 a.m.

Jeff Gordon voiced his concerns on the vacation of easement and its validity.

After discussion, the Commissioners decided to bring this item of business back after being reviewed by legal. In approximately two weeks.
