Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Clint Didier called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

9:11 a.m. .09 Economic Development Annual Recommendations

Port of Pasco Economic Director Stephen McFadden presented a background of how the economic development proposals were submitted and processed. Four proposals were received and are being presented today. Franklin County- HAPO Center Energy upgrades, City of Pasco-Process Water Reuse Facility, TRIDEC- Recruiting Leads and Staff, and Port of Pasco-Railroad Avenue Improvements at Reimann Center. Steve Worley gave an update on the wastewater dumpsite.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve resolution 2021-167. Commissioner Mullen seconded and the motion carried after discussion.

9:26 a.m. PUBLIC HEARING -Vacation of Easement 2021-02 531 Levey Road

Commissioner Didier recapped that the Public Hearing remained open since July 13, 2021 and he asked Administrator Keith Johnson, and Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten if there were any other public comments submitted since July 13. There were no additional public comments on the topic.

Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten provided additional information on the vacation of easement to the Board.

After the Board was briefed on the findings of the review, the Commissioners made a motion.

Commissioner Mullen moved to approve resolution 2021-144. Commissioner Peck seconded with discussion. No further comments. The motion carried 2:1 with Commissioner Peck opposing on the basis that the record is insufficient.

9:35 a.m. Sheriff's Office Body Cam Presentation

Captain Monty Huber presented a PowerPoint before the Board on the new mandate House Bill 1223- The Uniform Electronic Recordation of Custodial Interrogations Act. After much research, Captain Huber brought forth a proposal for Axon Enterprise as the best tool to fulfill this mandate. He provided a description of the company, and what they have to offer; in addition, he discussed pricing. Currently Pasco Police, West Richland Police, Prosser Police and Adams County Sheriff's Office are using the Axon system. Pending use is Kennewick Police, Richland Police Benton County Sheriff's Office, and Franklin County Sheriff's Office. All of these units are compatible, and work together if called to the same scene. Captain Huber highly recommends the use of the Axon system for Franklin County Sheriff's Office.

* Commissioner Didier, Commissioner Mullen and Commissioner Peck all supported moving forward with this recommendation.

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave provided a background for the need of reorganization of administrative positions in the Assessor's office, and incorporate a Senior Deputy Assessor and two Deputy Assessors.

After discussion of the needs and pending two retirees in the near future, the Commissioners brought it to a vote.

Commissioner Mullen moved to approve Resolution 2021-156. Commissioner Didier seconded and the motion carried 2:1 with Commissioner Peck opposed.

Presented by Human Resources Director Carlee Nave provided a background of the Juneteenth as a legal holiday in the state of Washington. On June 17, 2021, President Biden signed into law a bill recognizing Juneteenth as a federal holiday. To comply with the law, Franklin County is updating their Holiday Policy as well as Memorandums of agreement between the Appraisers Unit, Roads Unit and Courthouse Unit.
