### Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Clint Didier called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

Commissioners Present: Commission Chair Clint Didier, Chair Pro Tem Rocky Mullen and Member Brad Peck

#### 9:03 a.m. Commissioner/Administrator Updates

#### Administrator Keith Johnson update

- Voluntary Stewardship program- reviewed the past few years and planning on the next couple of years.
- Hired a new Administrative Assistant Jennifer Medelez
- WSAC discussed Rescue Plan Act and State's Covid response
- Finance Budget Committee meeting transferred a little over three-hundred fifty thousand dollars to reserve fund
- Response to our Comprehensive Plan challenge is ongoing.
- Board requested a Growth Management Act presentation and WSAC President Eric Johnson and Paul Jewel would be presenting this to us September 14, 2021.
- Waiting for Legal Counsel to direct Redistricting Committee

#### Commissioner Peck update

- Requested we move forward with remote meetings. Stated that Commissioner Didier had an exemption for a mask and the accommodation under the law who have this situation is to go to remote meetings. Since we have these tools to have remote meetings, we should recess after updates and remote in.

#### 9:19 a.m. Administration Office Business

Mr. Johnson brought forth a letter that encourages the community to get vaccinated. There is no suggestion in the letter of it being mandatory.

\* Commissioner Peck and Commissioner Mullen were in consensus to sign the letter and Commissioner Didier did not agree. 2:1 consensus

Mr. Johnson gave a background of retroactivity of resolutions 2019-104 and 2019-105. He asked the Commissioners if they were in favor of having those who have received retroactive payment, return those funds. If they did not, what direction did they want to go?

Attorney Shawn Sant advised those who were affected by these resolutions to follow the State Auditor's rules and return payment.

Commissioner Peck did not agree with the retroactive action and he believed Commissioner Koch expressed this same thought during the meeting in which it was discussed. He asked to hold off on any decisions until the State Auditor had an opportunity to review and weigh in on the matter.

- \* There was consensus from the Commissioners to wait for the State Auditor's review so see whether a finding is applicable.
- Consensus to cancel the September 7, 2021 meeting.

#### 11:12 a.m. Public Comment

- Jeffery Robinson voiced his concerns with conduct of the Commissioners.
- Trevor Crosby concerned about the vaccine mandate and people losing their jobs because of the mandate. He asked the Commissioners to stand against this mandate.
- Lawanda Hatch spoke on the unconstitutional mandate and the power that the Governor claims he holds. She voiced her concerns with Attorney Shawn Sant who stated that the public was committing tyranny because a crowd showed up to have their voices heard. She asked the Commissioners to man up and represent the people.
- Avrial Odell asked to see the science for the mask and asked for proof of it being effective. He asked that people stand up against this mandate.
- Quinn Odell agreed with his brother that people need to take charge and stand up against this mandate. He encouraged getting people back to work and the economy up and running. The Governor is mandating the vaccination and doesn't care about our religious rights.
- Ms. Dorsey would like to see her son go to school safely. She thanked Commissioner Peck for doing the right thing for our community.
