Commission Chairman Clint Didier called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

Commissioners Present: Commission Chair Clint Didier, Chair Pro Tem Rocky Mullen and Member Brad Peck

Correct motions from last week.

Commissioner Didier brought about the in last week's meeting regarding

A motion that the Board direct the PA and Mr. Bruner to withdraw the admission of fault to respond to the litigation by rejecting the assertions in the complaint. That was seconded and passed 2-1

There was a second motion to direct the Prosecuting Attorney to fully support the position communicated today and defend his client. Commissioner Mullen seconded. Motion carried 2-1

A third motion was brought forth but vote was not taken in the last meeting. To complete this motion, Commissioner Didier brought this motion before the Board.

- Mr. Johnson explained the postponement of the redistricting committee meetings.
- Salary Commission is not full and HR has not received any applicants.
- Prosecuting Attorney Shawn Sant explained some of the rules and process of the redistricting maps. Outside Council Casey Bruner also explained the data on the allegations of what is involved with redistricting matter.

10:16 a.m. Public Comment

- Citizen President of Latino group would like to help with distributing some of the ARPA funds for the Latino Community.
- John Rose questioned the data of census and how does it applies to the legal voting system. Are those being counted in the census for redistricting, citizens or just bodies? He feels underrepresented in the government of the state.
- Commissioner Peck responded that our objective to follow the law.
- Lawanda Hatch hoped that the redistricting committee would get a chance to do their job. She hoped that ultra violet lights would be put in the courthouse with the ARPA funds. Again asked for an investigation on who is running the redistricting committee.

10:28 a.m. Commissioner Mullen wanted to revisit the COLA of the elected officials.

* Commissioner Mullen moved that Franklin County Commission approve and except the 2019, COLA for the elected officials as it has been paid to date. We do not desire the PA to spend time on it, as this issue is considered settled, with no further actions needed. Commissioner Didier seconded. After discussion, the motion carried 2:1.

.Commissioner Didier recessed into Executive Session at 10:31 a.m., for up to 5 minutes to discuss potential litigation. Those participating are Commissioner Didier, Commissioner Mullen, Commissioner Peck, County Administrator Keith Johnson, Clerk of the Board Karin Milham, Attorney Shawn Sant and Administrative Assistant Jennifer Medelez.

10:36 a.m. Commissioner Didier reconvened the regular meeting.

* Mr. Sant asked for a motion to authorize him to cast a vote on behalf of Franklin County to vote in favor of the proposed settlement with the Opioid litigation, which includes several counties. Commissioner Peck so moved. Commissioner Mullen seconded and the motion carried.

10:39 a.m. Executive Session RCW 42.30.110(1)(i) - Potential Litigation

Commissioner Didier recessed into Executive Session at 10:39 a.m., for up to 30 minutes to discuss potential litigation. Those participating are Commissioner Didier, Commissioner Mullen, Commissioner Peck, County Administrator Keith Johnson, Clerk of the Board Karin Milham, Attorney Shawn Sant, Civil Attorney Jennifer Johnson, Outside Counsel Casey Bruner and Administrative Assistant Jennifer Medelez.

Commissioner Didier reconvened the regular session to announce the extension of executive session for an additional 30 minutes under the same RCW.

11:43 a.m. Commissioner Didier reconvened the regular session.

11:44 a.m. Public Comment

- John Rose voiced his concerns on censorship regarding Covid and science. What happened to my body, my choice, my decision? The mandates are anti-constitution.
- Lawanda Hatch concerned with demographer and census regarding citizens and known registered Latino voters.

11:49 a.m.

- Commissioner Didier gave his opinion on the current map and adjusting by the numbers. He did not agree on district only.
- Commissioner Mullen and those citizens who contacted him do not wish to have district only. He did not see much change in the numbers from a primary to a general; he does not believe we are a racist county and he finds that comment in the Tri-City Herald offensive. He wants to be fair and equitable to everyone.



Commissioner Peck believes we are duty bound to elected officials. The County has
already publicly taken a position in the summary judgement hearing that acknowledged we
in fact have polarized voting and our current system is in violation of the Voting Rights
Act. If we want to change that position with the court then that is a matter for the
Commissioners to consider and weigh individually. He has no personal interest in the
boundaries.

Mr. Sant asked the Chair what direction the Board would like to go. Mr. Sant announced that the final version of the map must be finished by November 8, 2021. Outside Counsel is able to bring three maps for the Board to review. A discussion on ways to adjust boundaries ensued.

October 19, 2021 is a tentative time to bring the maps to the Board.
