# 7:16 p.m. Public Comment

- Jeffery Robinson was disturbed by the behavior of Commissioners.
- John Logue applauded the Commissioners for standing up for the rights of the County.
- Citizen opposes the mandates of mask and vaccines.
- George Dockstader would like to know how when the public would be informed of how ARPA money is being used.
- Steve Bauman thanked the Commissioners for holding night meetings, as it is helpful to the community. He was disappointed that Commissioner Peck asked someone to contact the Governor's office and turn in Commissioner Didier for not wearing a mask in meetings. Concerned for the many firefighters, law enforcement, school staff and many others who lost their jobs due to the vaccine mandate.
- Steve Simmons asked Commissioners to send a notice to the Governor's office that the Schools are better equipped to know what is best in controlling mask and vaccine mandates in each school and not the Governor.

# 7:24 p.m. PUBLIC HEARING - Redistricting

Administrator Keith Johnson updated the public on what has taken place and what will happen going forward. The Committee will meet several times, and listen to the public comments, then bring a few map proposals for the Commissioners, in which they will to choose one.

- Jeffery Robinson gave his preference of map #1.
- John Rose preferred the map #4 for equal representation to all Latinos, or he suggested they consider a five member Commissioner Board.
- John Logue presented several statistics, one if which reports that Franklin County is 53.6% Latino and 39% Caucasian.

- Steve Bauman considered the best map for equity would be Map 4 with three long districts.
- Curt Didier said redistricting should have taken place a long time ago. He preferred at large voting.
- Curtis McGary preferred Map #4.
- Lawanda Hatch preferred Map #4
- Citizen Mendoza preferred Map #4
- Citizen preferred Map #1
- Jake Dorsey preferred Map#1
- Clay Whipple wanted equality
- John Logue wanted equal representation. He would like Latino voters to be encouraged to vote and be cohesive as a community.
- Gabriel Portugal discussed the differences between Latino voters and Non-Latino voters.
- Lawanda Hatch preferred Map 4.
- James Gimenez preferred Map 4.
- Steve Simmons preferred Map 4
- Kent McMullen because of the population growth, he suggested looking at a map that will address the future growth.
- David Hannum spoke of electing people with character and represent the public
- Jessica Castro represented herself and father. She listened to the Mesa redistricting meeting and asked the Commissioners to reach out to the Latinos.

#### 8:25 p.m.

Commissioner Mullen thanked everyone for coming out and participating in this meeting. He shared his feelings of hurt and disappointment with those who say, he could not represent the Latino due to the color of his skin.

Commissioner Peck spoke of his observations. He spoke of those who are living in the city could represent those in the county.

Commissioner Didier spoke of map 4 and how it would allow 3 positions from the either the city or the county, making it the most equitable. He does not like the process of segregation in the county.

### 8:45 p.m. Public Comment

- Jeffery Robinson opposes those who do not follow the law and treating others unkindly.
- Steve Bauman preferred having three Commissioners overseeing how tax dollars are being spent in the North County. He asked the Commissioners write a proclamation stating Franklin County opposes income tax.
- John Rose was surprised that there is fear in Latinos voting, when it is available as a mail in vote. He voiced his opinion that you do not need to be Latino to know what it is like to be disenfranchised.
- David Hannum voiced his concern for voter machine images that need to be kept for two years. Where does OSHA stand on the vaccine mandates?

• Commissioner Peck paid tribute to Colin Powell who passed away October 18, 2021.
