• The State's L&I sent a letter asking Franklin County to respond to a complaint of not enforcing mask mandate and social distancing during Commissioner Meetings. chose to ignore the first letter of request and this is the second opportunity to respond to their letter. Our response is public record. Commissioner Didier believed we are a free county with individual liberty. Commissioner Mullen was in agreement.

* Commissioner Didier moved that the Board of Commissioners instruct our Prosecuting Attorney to resist the motion for change in venue from Franklin County to Thurston County and that the Superior Court Judges elected in Franklin County will make a wise decision, and that the voters of Franklin County elected those Superior Court Judges, have faith in them to make a correct decision. Commissioner Mullen seconded. Commissioner Peck responded that State Law does not allow this venue to move to Thurston County. The motion carried.

- John Rose thank you for not increasing our taxes. The last few weeks I have brought you information on the Covid response and Ivermectrin that can help save lives. Other counties are leading the way. He asked the Commissioners to have the integrity and fortitude to recognize what protects these people in other countries and implement it in our county.
