- Lawanda Hatch was very concerned that she had two ballots registered in her name as well as receiving her daughter's ballet who has not lived at home for seven years. She requested an audit of the DMV to verify legality of ballots being sent out.
- Laurie Hales thanked the Commissioners for passing the one tenth of one percent. She wanted to know the next step in the process. She asked for transparency in the process.
- Angie Manterola suggested that misinformation is going around and asked the Commissioners to be transparent with the process and available to listen to your constituents.
- Kristi Voss is a parent of North Franklin School District and urged the Commissioners to reach out to their contacts and help in any way to rid the mask mandate in our schools.
- George Dockstader expressed his major concerns for the Roads in Franklin County. He reiterated building another bridge across the Columbia River.
- Steve Simmons grateful the county is taking steps to help with mental health. He wished that the county could have voted on the tax and not just the Commissioners to vote on the matter.

Administrator Keith Johnson brought forth an Interagency Agreement between the Department of Ecology and Franklin County Public Works to continue clean up at the Pasco Landfill.

Prosecuting Attorney Shawn Sant gave the background of the project and that Franklin County is eligible for this grant to clean up the landfill.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Interagency Agreement between the State of Washington, Department of Ecology and Franklin County Public Works IAA #C2200136 as presented and further authorize Engineer Craig Erdman to sign on behalf of the county. Commissioner Mullen seconded and the motion carried.
